

## **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

The Parish Council met on 20<sup>th</sup> January and 30<sup>th</sup> March. The next meeting will be the Annual Parish Meeting and AGM to be held on 25<sup>th</sup> May at Chorlton Lane WI Hall starting at 7.30pm when parishioners are invited to attend and address the Parish Council if they wish to do so. We are pleased to welcome Helen Groves to complete our quota of seven parish councillors after being co-opted at the last meeting. Helen is well known to most residents and can be contacted at Threapwood Garage and Post Office or on 01948 770207.

Richard our clerk has now agreed to take up the post on a permanent basis and is actively pursuing accreditation as a quality Parish Council that involves having demanding standards and procedures in place. The precept to fund the running of the Parish Council raised via your council tax will remain the same as last year.

Steps have been constructed on the slope of the south side of the footpath running between Mill House, Greaves Lane to the Drumbers, Back Lane. The work will be finalised during April. This now makes the footpath very accessible and can be

used as part of a circuit avoiding the main road past the Church where there is little protection from the passing traffic. Users of the path with dogs are requested to keep them on a lead to avoid distressing livestock at both Mill House and The Drumbers. We are grateful to our local Ward Councillor, Chris Whitehurst for arranging a grant to enable the work to be done.

Planning application 16/00524, The Hollies, Back Lane for a single story extension, garage, front and rear dormer windows and internal alterations has been approved. The Parish Council raised no objection.

The Parish Council has endorsed the concerns raised by Malpas Parish Council regards an application at Stockton Hall Farm, Oldcastle (15/05109/WAS) for an anaerobic digester plant for electricity generation from waste on the farm. Our principle concern relates to the possibility of HGV's using local lanes to transport a specified quantity of sugar beet to feed the plant. The applicants have since stated that the intention is to grow the necessary quantity of beet on the farm.

The Parish Council heard a presentation from a representative of the North West Ambulance Service on the benefits of having a defibrillator available for use by the community and the costs and logistics involved. Consideration on proceeding with securing and funding one will be made at a future meeting.

## **DOG OWNERS IN AND AROUND OUR VILLAGE**

During last autumn there were reports of a local dog worrying sheep which resulted in some deaths and injury. As dog owners we are all responsible for the control of our dogs at all times of the day and night and must be conscious of the threat that our pets could impose on both livestock and humans wherever we/they are. In law DPLA 1953 makes it an offence for dog(s) to worry livestock or to be at large in a field / enclosure in which there are livestock. Owners of livestock are entitled to shoot dogs which worry livestock under extreme circumstances and any ensuing vet / disposal fees are claimable from the owner of the dog. This is especially relevant at this time of year when many sheep are heavy in lamb as a result of worrying could result in both injury and abortion losses in the flock.

So fellow dog owners – please be responsible for your pets and keep them under control at all times in and around the village and surrounding countryside for the sake of everyone's enjoyment. Please, also clear up any poos with bags and take them home to the household bin. Poo bags are very cheap and easy to carry round in a pocket for use. It is not sufficient to hope that it will just disappear or that someone else will pick it up for you. It is certainly not nice to see poo on the verges of resident's properties and on our lanes whether you are a dog owner or not.
