

**THREAPWOOD PARISH COUNCIL
CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – 2017**

During 2016 -2017 the Parish Council (PC) has continued its business, making decisions on behalf of the community and listening to concerns and ideas. By and large the year has seen another settled and quiet period, building upon past initiatives, such as monitoring the effectiveness of the Speed Limit and trying to reinforce pedestrian links within Threapwood such as between Paths A&B on the attached sketch . Nevertheless, there has been some change.



- **Operation Shield** is Cheshire Constabulary's unique initiative to protect homes and businesses in Cheshire by reducing the number of repeat offenders, and identifying and recovering stolen goods. This initiative has been jointly funded by the Parish Council and Cheshire Constabulary with a grant from the Home Office. We are expecting the marker packs to be distributed by the Police this summer.

- **Planning Matters** In 2016 -17, Cheshire West and Chester have continued to take into account the Parish Council's comments and responses on behalf of their parishioners. We have received the following applications in Threapwood in the past 12 months: These include:-

- **Speed Limits Review.** Following complaints by residents about speeding traffic, the Parish Council has requested the Police visit Threapwood with their speed monitoring equipment.

Several Threapwood Councillors and members of the public have been trained in the use of a Speed Indicator Device (SID) and are now regularly monitoring the traffic speed on Wrexham Road and Sarn Road, evidence is needed to prove there is a speeding problem in the parish to warrant any future action. At the same time Threapwood PC has been Liaising with Malpas PC and Cuddington PM to address the speeding problem.

The Police have attended on several occasions and have checked the speed of traffic in different locations within Threapwood

- **Threapwood Parish Council Website.** The Parish Councils website is where you can find details of the councils Accounts, Minutes, Planning Register and Governance details, to publish some of these details on a website is now a mandatory condition for every smaller Parish Council.
- **Threapwood Facebook** is an opportunity for the public to interrelate with the council and others, posts regularly reach over 500 views.
- **The Audit,** Annually the parish council has to submit its accounts and other details for audit, the auditors must satisfy themselves that the accounts are prepared in accordance with statute and regulations and that proper accounting practice have been observed. All parish councils now have to publish their accounts and other information such as Agendas and Minutes, on a website in accordance with the Transparency Code for Smaller Authorities.
- **The Precept.** The Precept is the Parish Councils share of the Council Tax. The Precept demand goes to Cheshire West Council who then collect the tax on our behalf. For the year 2016-7 the Parish Council set the precept at £3000, this equates to a band D charge of £1.16 a month.
- **Budget.** Before the January Meeting the Councillors held a public meeting with parishioners to discuss the budget for 2017/18, provision of a seat, bus shelter and sports facilities were discussed, the deliberations were in mind when council set the following budget

- **Quality.** In March this year Threapwood Parish Council was awarded Quality status, the only parish or town council in Cheshire West to achieve the award which demonstrates that the Parish Council meets a minimum requirement for operating lawfully and according to standard practice and demonstrates that the council achieves good practice in governance, community engagement and council improvement.
- **Defibrillator** Thanks to a generous grant from the Lottery Fund and assistance from the Community Heartbeat Trust, the parish council will be placing a defibrillator at the Post

Office in the next few months. Tattenhall First Responders in conjunction with North West Ambulance Service will be offering defibrillator training on behalf of the Parish Council.
